(Continued from Page 1) dition they should be removed in the interests of a more slightly city.

The petition urged a general clean up, stating that water seepage from underground Lithia springs pipes in that vicinity caused a "malaria hole."

Dr. Mattie Shaw, one of the protesting property owners, appeared in person before the council and cited instances where she claimed to be at a disadvantage in keeping her property clean because of the blacksmith shop's proximity.

"Some time ago I sold the city property for the improvement of the street and afterward made a second sale of fifteen feet frontage for the purpose of widening the street."

It was stated the city had not taken action to properly widen the street as provided. Councilman Shinn said that the council might be censured for neglecting to fill up the street. The matter of improving the street was referred to the street committee.

Considerable discussion developed over the dumping of refuse in the vicinity of the blacksmith shop, it being stated the city had used the ground for such a purpose. Street Commissioner Fraley denied the charge, claiming the only dirt he knew about was that hauled from the recent excavation at the Presbyterian church. The "Presbyterian
