Albert Alford, Valley Pioneer, Dies At Talent

TALENT, Or., Nov. 1. - Albert Alford, for forty-six years a resident of Talent, passed away at his home in that place Sunday at 2:45 p. m., as a result of paralysis.

Mr. Alford was born in Missouri in the year 1833. In 1850 when but 17 years of age, he crossed the plains by ox team, and settled in the Willamette valley, where in 1853 he was married.

In 1869 Mr. and Mrs. Alford removed to the Rogue River valley, and resided north of Central Point until 1875, when they moved to Talent, where they have since resided.

Mr. Alford, in business affairs, was a man of success, but spent little time in public life. He was commissioner of Jackson county at the time the court house was built, and participated in the erection of that structure.
