RED CROSS RESCUED 600,000 FROM DEATH

Spent \$1,200,000 for Relief of Famine Sufferers in China Last Year.

To help overcome conditions of acute distress in five famine stricken provinces of Northern China, where millions of persons were affected by an unprecedented shortage of food.

Through the wide relief operations thus made possible it is estimated that more than 600,000 famine sufferers were saved from starvation.

The method of relief employed by the American Red Cross in its operations in China was particularly effective, for in addition to saving hundreds of thousands of lives it provided China with more than 900 miles of permanent roads that are sorely needed to prevent a recurrence of famine.

Can a Dog Exercise Discretion? A Massachusetts court was recently called upon to decide this question: Damages of \$1000 against an automobilist who ran over a dog hung on the decision of the court.

The dog owner contended that the dog was "in exercise of due care" when he was run down by an automobile. If the court finds that the dog was discreet the automobilist will have to pay.
