fish fail to find ladder at S. Rapids Dam GRANTS PASS, Or., Nov. 10.—Rogue river steelheads have not yet solved the problem of navigation further up the stream than the Savage Rapids dam.

When the water was checked for a test of the machinery a day before the opening of the project, nearly three tons of fish were stranded temporarily in a pool about sixty feet long. Dr. Bancroft, learning of their predicament, took several men with him and carried the fish to the running water.

In explaining their actions, Dr. George G. Bancroft, state game warden, said the steelhead naturally seeks the swiftest flowing water and after several days of fruitless trials to swim against the current, will drift down the river and then attempt another channel.
