Jackson County Budget Notice

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 118, General Laws of Oregon, 1921, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court room of the court house in the city of Jacksonville, Oregon, on Thursday, the 8th day of December, 1921, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimate of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published herewith, by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Jackson County.

The County Budget Committee for Jackson County, Oregon, has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of county government, county office or county officer, each county improvement, the maintenance of each county building, structure or institution, the salary of each county officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation, and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants; and estimate of the public receipts of the county from sources other than direct taxation upon the real and personal property in the county during the period for which such tax is to be levied, and the amount of balances on hand in the funds of the county at the time the levy will be made.
