

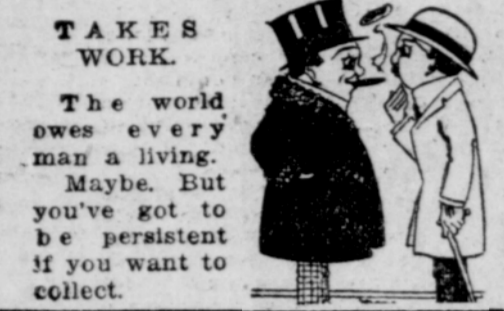

"I Refuse to Allow Myself to Be Called a Zionist. I Am an American"

Zionism is the most stupendous fallacy in Jewish history. The political and physical rehabilitation of Palestine into a national entity is an empty and impossible dream, unsound in its economics, fantastic in its politics and sterile in its spiritual ideals. Zionism is a surrender, not a solution. It is a retrogression into the blackest error, and not progress toward the light. I will go further and say that it is a betrayal; it is an eastern European proposal, fathered in this country by American Jews, which, if it were to succeed, would cost the Jews of America most that they have gained, liberty, equality and fraternity.

Zionism is based upon a literal acceptance of the promises made to the Jews by their prophets in the Old Testament, that Zion should be restored to them and that they should resume their once glorious place as a peculiar people, singled out by God for his especial favor, exercising dominion over their neighbors in His name and enjoying all the freedom and blessings of a race under the unique protection of the Almighty. Of course, the prophets meant these things symbolically and were dealing only with the spiritual life. They did not mean earthly power or materialistic blessings.

Zionism arose out of the miseries of the Jews. It was offered as a remedy, a release, a plan of action which would provide a road to happiness. This is the secret of its hold upon its adherents. The promises which it offers are so dazzling that Jews everywhere have rushed to embrace its faith without stopping to examine them closely or to calculate whether they can be made good.

Here in America we have fought our way through to liberty, equality and fraternity. We have found the rest for our souls. No one shall rob us of these gains. We enjoy in America exactly the spiritual liberty, the financial success and the social position which we have earned. Any Jew in America who wishes to be a saint of Zion has only to practice the cultivation of his spiritual gifts—there is none to hinder him. Any Jew in America who seeks material reward has only to cultivate the powers of his mind and character—there are no barriers between him and achievement. Any Jew in America who yearns for social position has only to cultivate his manners—there are no insurmountable discriminations here against true gentlemen. The Jews of France have found France to be their Zion. The Jews of England have found England to be their Zion. We Jews of America have found America to be our Zion. Therefore, I refuse to allow myself to be called a Zionist. I am an American.

BAR WOMAN SMOKING IN JAIL

Lincoln, Neb., Chief of Police Acts When Men Demand Equal Rights.

Lincoln, Neb.—Women confined in the Lincoln city jail may no longer console themselves with a whiff from a satisfying cigarette, Chief of Police Peter Johnstone announced today after prisoners had complained of a violation of equal rights.

The unequal rights, however, were in favor of the women instead of the men. One rule prohibited smoking. Exceptions have been made in favor of the women smokers by the chief.

Police Matron Dora Doyle admitted that she permitted the women to smoke upon order of the chief.

But the fumes of the denied weed, penetrating into the quarters of the men, caused the smoke hunger of these less fortunate individuals to cry out for vengeance, and finally the protest came when the men could stand it no longer. "We demand equal rights anyway," the men said.

Chief of Detectives Walter Anderson, became the champion of the men's cause and protested vigorously to the chief.

purpose of the new hotel was to attract to Ashland a different class of customers from those patronizing Hotel Ashland, whose business would not therefore be interfered with by the new hostelry, but rather increased by adding to the trade and population of Ashland.

H. G. Enders stated that he regarded his \$1500 subscription merely as a short-time loan, since he felt confident of making it all back within one year after the hotel was built, through the increased volume of business which would come to his store.

E. V. Carter referred to a similar meeting which he attended in 1888 for the purpose of raising a bonus to build the present Hotel Ashland. J. P. Dodge and G. F. Billings also attended the former meeting, as

well as the one held today. The amount subscribed on the former occasion was either \$1500 or \$2500.

G. F. Billings said he believed that the bonus fund might be substantially increased if the committee would pass the subscription paper to people who would each give \$100 or less. He believed that many farmers would be glad to give money and that numerous laborers would each give a week's work on the new building.

A. C. Nininger struck the keynote of the meeting when he said that we all should consider ourselves as one big family or society, and that whatever the majority agreed upon as best for the community, the rest should be willing to do their share.

Miss Grace Chamberlain and Mrs. H. T. Elmore announced that the ladies of the Civic Improvement club although primarily interested in finishing their community club room, would be glad to help in every way possible, even to making a cash donation.

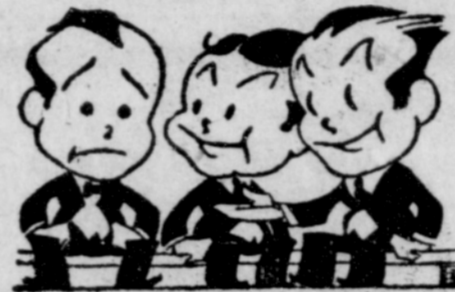

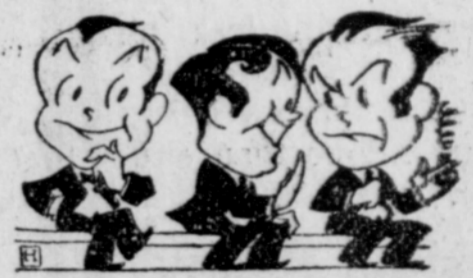
