#### China's Trade Rich

China, as a commercial field, is very well worth cultivating. Even under very adverse conditions in that country-with political division and turmoil-its gross foreign trade for the year 1920 was in excess of \$1,000,000,000. This showed enormous gain as compared with 1911, when its commerce total was \$650,-100,000. The United States is doing very small commercial business with China-amounting only to 84 per cent in 1920. This country's imports into China totaled nearly \$74,000, 600, and its exports from China were nearly \$42,000,000. Great Britain and Japan hold supremacy in trade with the ancient country. Strangely enough, their percentages are almost exactly the same-Great Britain's 37.6 and Japan's 37.7 per

As China's sales of its own productions increase, its ability to buy the products of other countries should expand correspondingly. 
