To Add Six Miles to Manhattan Island

NEW YORK.—New Yorkers who often pretend to be indifferent to the city's wonders have had their imagination stirred by the daring plan, just announced, to extend Manhattan island six miles down the bay by building mammoth sea walls from both sides of the Battery and filling in the intervening space with earth.



A company has been incorporated to carry out the project, and T. Kennard Thompson, a prominent engineer of the city, has prepared the detailed plans. The Broadway association, composed of merchants along the famous thoroughfare, has endorsed the idea.

If the plan is ever carried out, its proponents say that six square miles would be tacked on the most valuable piece of land on earth; that twelve miles of needed docks would be added to the port's facilities; that transit would be greatly improved and that the tax on all real estate might be reduced 1 per cent.

IT IS a good plan to have as much as possible of the preparation for our feast day done the day before. Some things are better done ahead of time, for example, cranberry jelly and stuffing the turkey.

When making the pumpkin pie, just add a few drops of lemon-essence with the ginger used in seasoning, and notice the improvement in flavor.

Cranberry frappe is a delicious way of serving that berry. Strain the cooked berries, using two cupsful, a cupful of sugar and a pint of water, two tablespoonfuls of lemon juice to set the color, and freeze as usual.

If one has gathered the firm green tomatoes before the frost has nipped them and wrapped each in a square of paper, place them in a very cool

cellar, they will be ripe and firm to use for a salad for a Thanksgiving day supper.

Cider Salad. To one quart of sweet cider, add the juice of two lemons, one and one-half cupfuls of boiling water, four tablespoonfuls of granulated gelatin, one-fourth cupful of sugar, two cupfuls of seeded and skinned white grapes. Soften the gelatin in one-half cupful of cold water; add the hot water, then the other ingredients. Let cool before adding the grapes. Turn into small molds and chill.

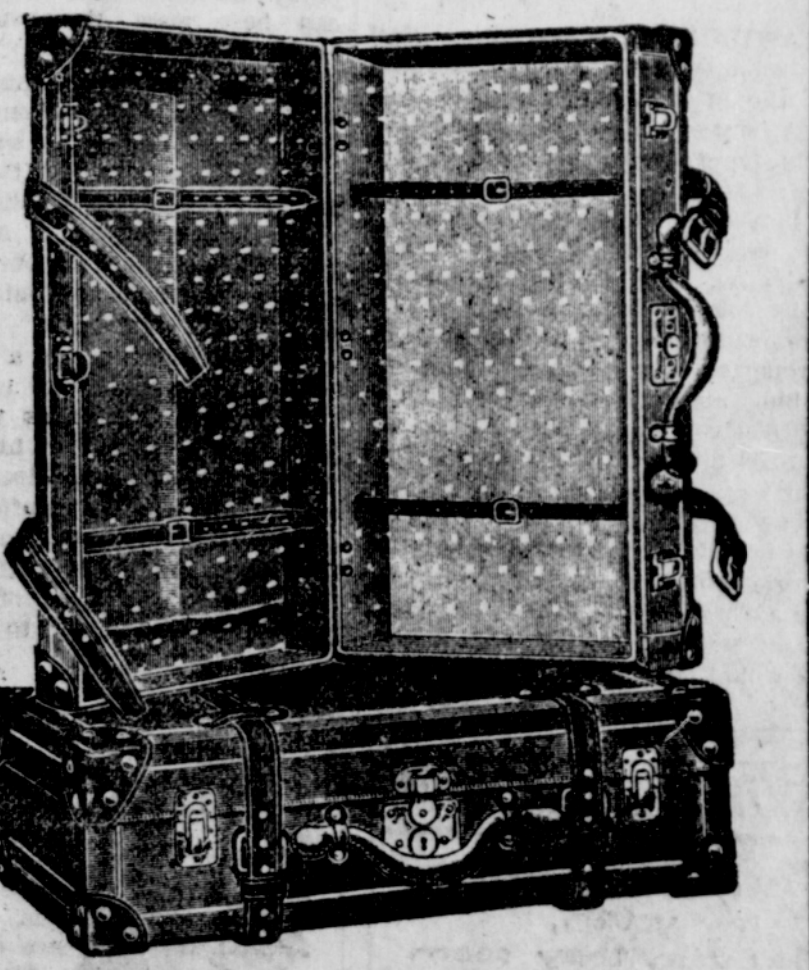
