NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT ON AND AFTER THIS DATE it will be unlawful for any vehicles carrying a load of more than five tons to pass over the paved Pacific highway between the city limits of Ashland and the Rock Point bridge north of Gold Hill; and that it will be unlawful for any vehicle carrying a load of more than three tons to pass over any other part of the paved Pacific highway.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the limit of all loads on any vehicle passing over any of the macadam or dirt roads within Jackson county shall not exceed two tons.

Fall Freshening Best — Fall freshening cows yield from 10 to 20 per cent more milk during the year than those freshening in the spring, says a bulletin from the experiment station of the Oregon Agricultural college. Their greatest yield comes at the season when the prices are highest, which makes this a profitable dairy practice. Breed cows as far as practicable in December, January and February for freshening in September, October and November.
