AMBASSADOR OF GERMANY; 5 YEARS

spending a nice little sum in renovating and remodeling the Long residence, a stately mansion which was thought entirely fit as a residence for the King of Belgium when he visited Washington some time ago.

Sweden has helped the unemployment situation here by setting numerous carpenters and stone masons and other artificers at work on a huge new embassy on Fifteenth street.

Poland, a new nation, has seen fit to take over one of the finest residences on fashionable Sixteenth street. Many of the other new nations, and some not so new, but nevertheless prosperous, have recently established themselves in fine homes in fine sections of the city.

The German ambassador will probably feel lonesome when he arrives here, for though the German embassy is not a shack, it hardly compares with the official dwelling places of the majority of the diplomatic corps here.

had to take the responsibility of singling any out for prizes, in that the points on which the awards had

to be made were not understood in like manner by all of the contestants—for instance, the two schools worked along different lines. One emphasized originality and suggested outside help as to ideas; the other wanted its work to be absolutely the student's own endeavors, and therefore was more like a class-room display. Both had a claim to consideration, for we surely want an exhibit of the student's own work, yet, at the same time, children have to have suggestions in order to stimulate originality. Too, in a compe-

dition of this kind it is fun to get the whole family at work on ideas and make a regular game out of the lesson involved, instead of a mere duty of getting up a poster, and all goes toward helping the child get inspiration and co-operation in his work, if at the same time sufficient care is taken to have the finished display entirely the student's work.

"Perhaps, in the future fairs, a basis of competition can be settled before hand and then there will be better feeling over the outcome."
