A Douglas county clip was pronounced by a buyer equal in quality to any produced in the United States which indicates that we have here in western Oregon unusually good natural conditions for the production of fine wools.

The chief reason why so much of our wool is graded out and sold at a low price in inferiority of animals, due to poor breeding. Only 1000 pounds was graded out of my 18,000 pound clip of Merino and Rambouillet wool. At the Winter Fair last week many visitors were astonished to see a fleece weighing twenty-four pounds. I had six bucks which sheared thirty pounds each. "The present price of Oregon wool is 15 to 26 cents. Ohio sheep men, who are well organized, were able to sell for 40 cents."
