ONE TIME LOCAL "TEASE" FETED AS STAGE COMEDIAN

Don Barclay, subject of an extended sketch in a recent issue of the San Francisco Examiner, and a popular actor on the comedy stage, was born in Ashland twenty-eight years ago. He is a cousin of Victor Mills, who furnishes some interesting information about the popular comedian, who has earned big salaries in New York and London theaters. "Don's father was Thaddeus Barclay, my mother's brother, who used to keep the store at Talent now operated by Chester Walters," related Mr. Mills. "Don's father died while he was still quite young and his mother had a hard time making a living. She used to dressmaking in the rooms over the old Blue Front bakery. They lived on Second street just below the Silsby place. "During his Ashland school days, Don showed a great talent for drawing comical pictures. Mrs. Fred Engle—at that time Miss Grace Garrett, was one of his teachers. He also developed histrionic ability at an early age, doing trapeze and other acrobatic stunts in a barn which the Mowatt boys used for that purpose. He also imitated the work of professional actors who visited Ashland, for the amusement of his boy companions. "Don was very mischievous and a great tease. He and I used to get along together very well when we were alone, but in a crowd we generally took opposite sides. He and his mother left here when Don was twelve and went to San Francisco, where he sold papers, drew cartoons and finally got into the acting game, where he has since scored a wonderful success. He says that Homer Davenport was once in Ashland and highly praised some of his drawings, but I do not recall the occurrence."
