Cattle Free from Tuberculosis—

Progress in testing Oregon cattle is reported in the Extension Service News. The work has been completed in Deschutes, Crook, and Polk counties, and has been started in Benton. Delay in other counties is caused by the limited number of testers available. Reports on the five counties named show that 11,734 animals were tested, of which 109 reacted and 73 were listed as suspects. Less than 1 per cent definitely reacted, and only 1.25 per cent showed any symptoms of the disease. This is considered remarkably low in comparison with tests in many other states and is said by the Oregon Agricultural college extension service to indicate that the state is relatively free of tuberculosis in its cattle.

Collect Money on Chrome Claims— With passage of a bill by congress authorizing payment of chrome mining claims, Oregon miners will have the first opportunity since the conclusion of the war to collect the \$1,000,000 outstanding in chrome claims. Authority for payment of claims to war-time chrome miners has not previously been provided for except in a narrow sense. One-third of the chrome mined in the United States during the war was secured from Oregon mines.—Portland Journal.

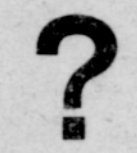
