STATE TO WAGE WAR ON DRUG TRAFFIC

SALEM, Or., Jan. 11.—Plans for the official fight of the state of Oregon against the illicit traffic in narcotics are being formulated here today by Governor Olcott and members of the state boards of health and pharmacy in joint conference.

Frank S. Ward, secretary of the pharmacy board, and Dr. Frederick Stricker, secretary of the board of health, have both prepared reports on the sale and use of narcotics in Oregon at the request of Governor Olcott, and the discussions here are centering around these reports.

Today's conferences are in the nature of a preliminary session to a meeting in Portland tomorrow, to which Governor Olcott has invited public officials from all parts of the state who are interested in suppression of the drug traffic.

TEN MILLION INVOLVED IN RUM PLOT

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Jan. 10.—Cleveland today was the center of activity in an alleged \$10,000,000 liquor withdrawal conspiracy and bootlegging plot involving prominent men, following the arrest of four men who were indicted secretly at the last session of the federal grand jury here.

Those under arrest are: Harry S. Lynn, head of the Lynn company, wholesale drug firm of Akron; Martin Burke, head of a Pittsburg hardware concern; George Martino, the treasurer; and Claud R. Madeline, secretary of the Lynn company. All were charged with conspiracy to violate the national prohibition act.
