MONTANA COPPER

MINES REOPENING

(By International News Service) BUTTE, Mont., Jan. 17.—A big revival in the copper industry became effective yesterday with the resumption of the mines and reduction plants in the Butte, Great Falls and Anaconda mining districts.

A horizontal wage decrease of 50 cents a shift was also scheduled to go into effect, according to a recent announcement of the mining companies.

Curtailment of work in the Butte district was started in 1919, climaxing in the closing of the mines last April. Men are expected to be put back to work as fast as they applied for employment.
