WHY ARE BUBBLES ROUND?

A SOAP bubble, to use as an example, is merely a hollow ball of water with air inside. The soap, partially dissolved, forms a very thin film or skin over the air which is endeavoring to force its way through it.

However, after the bubble has been floating for a few moments, the water drips down toward the bottom of the ball and collects there in drops. The weight of these pulls the bubble out of shape—spoils its perfect symmetry—and increase the pressure of the air inside to such a degree that it breaks through the film and the bubble bursts.
