OW to know apple trees by their leaves, and not alone by their fruit, bids fair to become part of the business of the successful orchardist as a result of seven year's research by the experimental station of the Massachusetts Agricultural college at Amherst. Systematic study of the leaf characters of young apple trees conducted by Dr. J. K. Shaw, expert pomologist, has enabled him to announce a new method of identifying nursery stock that promises to remove one of the most serious risks of fruit




