from the United States to Mexico during the eight months ending with August last, seems somewhat anomalous the decline in values of goods impor-ted by us from Mexico during the same time," says the St. Louis Globe-

In an analysis of the figures, issued by the National Association for the Protection of American Rights in Mexico, the statement is made that the enormous increase in exports to Mexico reflects the paralysis of that country's industry, due to the uncertainty of land owners about their titles and to business men about profit sharing laws which are referred to in Mexico as the strangle laws. A very large proportion of the goods imported by Mexico consists simply of food and Anished necessities of life. Mexico's exports have been declining steadily in volume for about two years during which period her imports have been rising, sometimes gradually and someor revolutions in progress, also according to the condition of the Na-

tional Railways. The only article which Mexico exports that does not show both a decline in volume and value is petroloum. With this item removed, the exports of the country are negligible. More than sixty per cent of the revenue of the National Government is now obtained from taxes on oil.
