

To steam a fish, season with salt, pepper and cover the top with thin strips of salt pork and place on a Follow directions for scalloped plate. Set in a steamer over boiling water, cover closely and steam ten to twelve minutes for each pound

For boiling fish have the water boiling. Add one tablespoon of vinegar to a quart of water, also a tablespoon each of chopped onion and carrot, a tiny bit of bay leaf and thyme. Lower the fish gently into the water and cook at the simmering

point until tender. The time required is usually from six to ten minutes for each pound of fish.

Fish will hold its shape and can be handled easier if wrapped in a piece of cheesecloth before placing in the hot water. A rack or plate should be placed on the bottom of the kettle to prevent the fish from WANTED-Second hand Ford car. sticking and possibly burning.


