They are miniatures of their "big sisters," those Fashionable Ones, the painted wooden doll heads that stand in the milliners' windows, posing under dashing French hats—

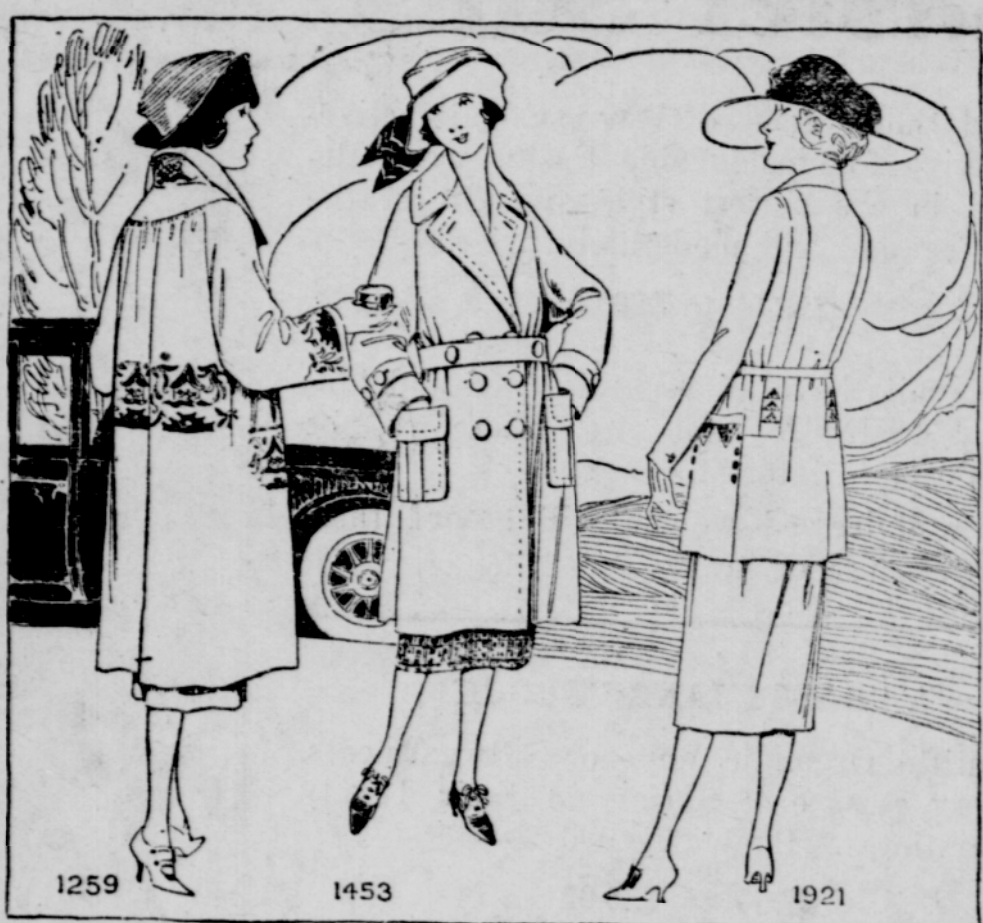
## PERIOD OF UNIVERSAL JOY

In All Lands and in All Times the Celebration of the Rebirth Has Been General

Wars have been waged over what should be the proper day for the celebration of Easter. Churches have been rent by differences of opinion as to how the festival should be observed. Easter has been the first day of the year, and, for hundreds of years at a time, there have been not

one but often several Easters, each defended by its advocates. In the controversy both sun and moon have been called in to give testimony and since these two witnesses failed fully to agree there has grown up a difference, so that our Christian Easter might be called the sun Easter, whereas the near-by Passover of the Jews might be termed the moon Easter or moon Passover. It was indeed, according to much weighty testimony, a carrying on into Christ-

endom of the Passover idea by which the paschal lamb became the Christ, or rather Christ the paschal lamb, in the beautiful church symbolism. And further back this rare time of spring's rebirth, of nature's own resurrection, had been celebrated in pagan lands, because of that instinct that seemed to have asserted itself in man at certain times of the year to pause amid his routine labors and give thanks to a supernal power, invisible and all present, for the great truths of life.
