TAX-EXEMPTS

Secretary Mellon, in urging favorable action on a resolution to amend the constitution to prohibit issuance of tax-exempt securities, said: "Denial of the privileges of issuing taxexempt securities would curb the extravagance of some municipalities and local governments."

"If issuance of tax-exempt securities is allowed to continue, a social upheaval will occur, which may be so far-reaching in effect as to undermine our constitutional government," says Congressman McFadden of Pennsylvania.

"It has been estimated that ap-exempt securities have been issued by the government and states and other political subdivisions. In the last few years we have seen personal wealth of this country so rapidly segregated into the tax-free class that, whereas taxable income of individual taxpayers under federal income tax law was \$992,972,985 in 1916. the amount decreased to \$731,373,-053 in 1917, and to \$352,247,329 in 1918."
