E. B. Poyer, of Ashland, owns the herd with the greatest average production for the month, 877 pounds of milk and 44.20 pounds of butterfat. J. R. McCracken's Jerseys averaged 708 pounds of milk and 40.01

Option on Grounds Suitable for Hotel Site

No proposition will be considered unless made as a legal option on blanks supplies by me. Option must be direct from owner, and husband or wife, if married. The lowest NET price must be named in the option. All option are for 60 days, with privilege of renewal upon payment of one-tenth of purchase price. Land any place within corporate limits of Ashland will be considered. Will buy either with or without buildings, but offers for land without buildings will be favored. The smallest piece that will be considered is 150x150 feet, or any tracts larger up to 20 acres. The land must be located within the city limits. The land must be optioned at your lowest cash price, and no commission whatever will be charged by me on any of the ground selected for the new hotel site. A man will be sent here by the hotel investors to make estimates of cost on buildings and suitable grounds within the next two weeks. All options must be in before he arrives so that he can be shown the grounds. No grounds will be considered except that optioned. I hope citizens submitting offers will fix their prices at a reasonable figure. No ground will be submitted to which any commission has been added. It must be the lowest cash price you are willing to take. I have no knowledge, or idea, what part of town, or where the site will be selected, any more than you have, or what size site will be determined on. If you have what you deem an available site and will option it on blanks to be supplied by me and on the terms set forth therein, it will be submitted to the investor's agent and receive the same consideration that any other offer receives. I guarantee that I will not charge either the investor or the seller one cent of commission on the ground selected for the hotel site. It is my object to put the investor in at the lowest possible net price that can be obtained. The price you make in the option will be considered confidential and if my investors do not take your property, the terms of your offer will not be made known to anyone. All options must be completed before May 10th, 1922. I will not solicit options from anyone, but will receive options from all who desire to make them. Two or more, with property adjoining, by consulting together and each giving an option on their property, would be an advantage, as the agent could elect to take one, two or all of them, according to the space requirement, in case he liked the location as a suitable site for the hotel. At present my office is at the Tidings office, where you can get the option blank.
