INHALING OF AUTO GAS

KILLS GARAGE WORKER
DENVER, May 12.—Emil Pederson, 38, an automobile mechanic, is dead here from "auto gas." While working in a garage, Pederson is said to have inhaled large quantities of monoxide gas from the exhaust of an engine and physicians declare this gas caused his death.

SOLE SURVIVOR OF TRAGEDY

UNDERGOES OPERATION
RED BLUFF, Calif., May 12.—Miss Opal McNaughton, only survivor of the Proberta disaster on November 30th, last, when 14 high school students from the Dairyville district were killed at a railroad crossing, has undergone an operation regarded as necessary to restore her to normal health. The operation was performed at the Woodland Sanitarium, to which institution she was removed several weeks ago, and was on the left leg. As a result of this and a previous operation, each leg will be half an inch shorter than normal.
