Has anybody in Jackson county a field of Grimm alfalfa that has produced without irrigation more than four tons of hay to the acre? No "horse back" weights, but actual weights of hay dry enough to bale. How many acres have you, how old, and how many tons of hay in three consecutive years?

Here is a scheme to get a good stand of young alfalfa that has been tried out on one of our local dry farms for several years. Cut the wildoats, mustard and other weeds early, before there is any seed formed; then about every three weeks pasture the alfalfa with a bunch of sheep, make them eat it until the ground is almost bare. The alfalfa will go all to roots instead of top growth, but it will also spread the crown to a surprising extent, and will make a big crop the following year because of the strong roots and wide crown. If by any chance there was dodder in the alfalfa seed, the sheep will prevent it from going to seed and your field is clean.

President F. W. Herrin and Manager R. A. Ward of the Pacific Cooperative Wool Growers addressed a meeting of wool and mohair growers in C. C. Cate's office recently. It is safe to say that everybody present is a strong booster for cooperative wool marketing and that every grower who does not sell his wool this way is losing money.
