You cannot change from the loan to cash after that date. But you can change from cash to loan after that date.

Apply for a \$3000 loan, and you can only get 75 per cent of the property valuation. If your loan will only amount to \$1500, as soon as you have paid up that loan you are entitled to secure another loan up

to the \$3000 applied for originally. If you can only get \$1000 the first time, you still have \$2000 to go on, and can take it as soon as you have paid up the first \$1000.

Sure, you pay it back—the only time that you never had to pay back a loan was when you were in the service.

**ROW IN RED BLUFF C. OF C.**

**CAUSES SECRETARY TO QUIT RED BLUFF, Calif., May 19.**

Strained relations between President R. M. Norvell and Secretary H. D.
