TEN THOUSAND PEOPLE GASP THROUGH NIGHT ON THE LAKE FRONT

Mercury Had Reached 96 at Noon Today and There Is Great Suffering in Congested Districts of South and West Sides.

CHICAGO, June 8 .- The first heat casualties of this season were recorded today when five deaths and one prostration were reported.

The temperature is rising steadily, reaching 96 at 1 o'clock.

The terrific wave of heat has brought acute suffering among the poor in the congested districts of the south and west sides. The lake front is crowded with thousands of people, although there is practically no breze being blown off the lake as is customary, and the surface is not disturbed by a ripple of wind.

It is estimated that not less than ten thousand people slept out of doors on the lake front last night.
