But I wish to put the story before the public and let them judge for themselves, whether it is the truth or not. I have a wife, mother and sisters of my own, and why should I not treat any poor woman as I would like to have them treated if they were in the same circumstance.

This story has sorely injured my pride and name and I CHALLENGE any person or persons to make a public statement saying that the story is the truth—an absolute fact. If there is a person who can prove such a falsehood, I will gladly take the consequences. But I feel that a great injustice has been placed upon me.
