Mrs. Silsby is the mother of C. S. Silsby of this city and was herself a resident of Ashland for a number of years, but moved to the northern town several years ago, having lived there continuously since that time.

**Ford Co. Turns Out Motor No. 600,000**

Ford motor No. 600,000 was lifted from the assembly line in the Highland Park Ford plant at 9:14 a. m., May 18th. Just five and one-third seconds later No. 6,000,001 was finished.

The unusually heavy demand for Ford cars and trucks at the present time has necessitated the building of 5400 motors daily. These are shipped in carload lots to the various Ford assembling plants throughout the United States.

The first Model "T" Ford motor was completed on October 1, 1908, number 1,000,000 left the assembly line December 10, 1915; and number 5,000,000 came through May 28, 1921.

Commenting on this marvelous production, Harrison Brothers, the Ford agents in Ashland, pointed out that this record took in only the production since 1908, although prior to that time the company had built a great many motors of which no record had been kept.

**CONGRESS THREATENED BY PRESIDENT ON SHIP SUBSIDY**

WASHINGTON, June 13.—President Harding opened his fight in

congress today for an early enactment of the administration's ship subsidy bill.

Chairman Campbell of the house rules committee, made public a letter from the president, declaring that congress would be convened in extraordinary session to consider the merchant marine legislation, if it failed to act on the measure during the present session.

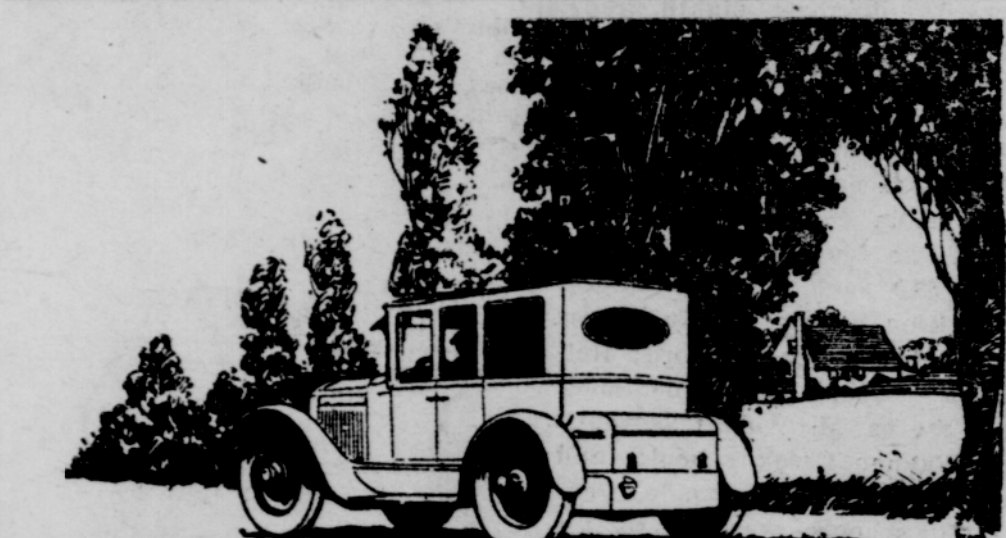
