There are nineteen national parks, with a total area of 10,859 square miles, under the supervision of the secretary of the interior and seven national military and other parks under the supervision of the secretary of war, and a number of other national monuments, such as the petrifled forests of Arizona, etc., under the jurisdiction of the secretaries of the interior, agriculture and war. For many years the Hot Springs reservation of Arkansas was the only national park. In 1832 an area of 11/2 square miles on which are 46 hot springs possessing curative properties was set aside as a national park. It was not until forty years later that another national park was created, the Yellowstone, in Wyoming. The other 17 have been created within forty-two years, and seven of these within the last decade, the interest in conservation probably accounting for the larger number. The only one in New England is Lafayette park in Maine, on
