"It should be remembered," he added, "that the Southern Pacific has not sought and is not seeking control of any other lines, nor is it urging the separation of a line from some other ownership for its own advantage. We merely ask that the Southern Pacific lines be allowed to continue as a single operating unit in order that the public in its own interest may have the advantage of this company's unbroken public service as a common carrier, rather than a badly disrupted service, as a substitute.

"We ask this only in the orderly processes of the law. We believe that the great public interest is best served by recognizing the advantages of the larger and extended and convenient service given to that publiee by the present railway system of the Southern Pacific company under existing control. The commissions, state and federal, are endowed with all the powers necessary to make their regulative control potent and complete.

"There can be nothing improper in our asking the support of the publie toward bringing this difficulty to an utimate conclusion that will rainta's operations of this transportation systems as a unit justified by the general experience of the people so served. If necessary to accomplish this purpose it may even be that a new law should be enacted to meet the situation."

If, after wiring up a set, you hear nothing but a steady hum in the receivers, you may be very sure that there is an open circuit somewhere. Trace out the wiring carefully and some little fault will present itself.

The so-called "spaghetti" tubing, if placed over bare wire used in wiring a set, will improve the appearance 100 per cent and reduce the danger of short circuits.
