VANCOUVER, B. C., July 7 .-Amid the ashes of their homes, the citizens of Merville, Vancouver Island, called the roll today and found Jack Clifford and Ernest Layland did not answer. They lost their lives part of Merville last night.

Nearly 50 families are homeless. It is feared that many small settlements along the coast, from which no reports can be expected for days, n have been wiped out by the forest




