The pear and cherry slug, the slimy brown creature now found skeletonizing the pear and cherry trees, may readily be controlled by regular applications of arsenate of lead 2-100. Where only a few trees itates to apply the arsenate, any finely divided dust such as airslaked lime, sifted wood ashes, or road dust, applied to the foliage, will effectually control them.
