Control Pear and Cherry Slug The pear and cherry slug, the slimy brown creature now found skeletonizing the pear and cherry trees, may readily be controlled by regular applications of arsenate of lead 2-100.

Spray for Codling Moth A protective poison spray should be applied at once where the apple worm was serious last year, as adult codling moths are continuing to appear in limited numbers and eggs are being deposited.

Vetch Seed in Demand Hairy vetch is in demand as a seed crop. Western Oregon can grow it.

Surface Cultivation Brings Results Frequent shallow surface cultivation of garden and truck soils is an excellent practice for conservation of soil moisture.

Apply Lead Arsenate The beetles on late potatoes usually may be controlled by adding adding two pounds lead arsenate to

100 gallons of Bordeaux solution, as applied for disease control. Where spraying for beetle alone, to the lead arsenate solution add one gallon of molasses to each 50 gallons of dilute spray.

Much poorly filled grain will make better hay than grain and should be cut for that purpose or for silage. Harvest and threshing costs are too high to make it worth while threshing poorly filled grain when it can be used for hay.

Remove Wilted Canes Wilted and dying canes of loganberries and raspberries observed in the field may be removed by giving them a twist and a pull.
