**GOVERNMENT IS FACING DEFICIT OF \$425,000,000**

WASHINGTON, July 13.—The government faces a net deficit of \$425,000,000 for the current fiscal year, President Harding yesterday informed the second annual business meeting of federal executives. Receipts for the year were estimated at \$3,074,090,000 and expenditures at \$3,771,000,000, leaving an apparent excess of expenditures amounting to \$697,000,000, reduced however by the general balance of \$272,000,000 in the treasury on June 30.
