**WILL MEET WITH
ROCKEFELLER
INSTITUTE MAN**

Dr. P. W. Covington, of the Rockefeller Foundation Institute, will be in Medford Wednesday, July 19, where he will be the guest and principal speaker at a chamber of commerce forum luncheon at the Hotel Medford.

Dr. Covington explained the advantages to be derived from the adoption of the Rockefeller Foundation system in combination with the state board of health, when he met with the local chamber of commerce at a picnic supper in Lithia park several weeks ago, and his visit to Medford next Wednesday is for the purpose of getting a branch of the great institution located in Jackson county, if he can obtain the required co-operation of the people of the county.

Jackson county is one of five counties in the state to whom this proposition has been submitted at this time. Coos county has already accepted the unit offer.

The aim of this work is to prevent disease and decrease the death rate. The securing of experienced men and women who will be in charge of this work will be another proof that Jackson county is composed of progressive, intelligent people who realize the importance of sanitation and general health measures. When it may be shown by figures that there is a decrease in the death rate, which is higher than it should be, a decrease in communicable diseases, and an increased interest in public health, Jackson county will be in a better position to advertise as a health resort.
