COURSE OF STUDY OUTLINED FOR OREGON SCHOOLS

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, July 21.—In an address to the Principals' club, this week, J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of public instruction, outlined the new course of study for the Oregon grade and high schools, which will be in effect for two years from next September.

Superintendent Churchill appealed to the schoolmen present to carry out faithfully the provisions of the state law providing for 20 minutes of physical education daily for every student in the public schools. This exercise, the superintendent pointed out, must be taken in the regular school period and not at recesses.

Among the changes in the study course will be the introduction of six weeks of Oregon history study at the opening of the year, in the eighth grade. Agriculture also will be taught in the eighth grade again next year. To make room for these subjects, the course has been lightened in some other respects.
