**LAMB CUTLETS WITH GREEN OLIVE DRESSING**



NO matter how tender the cutlets may be they require a tasty dressing. Without it there is something lacking. With it they attain their full measure of deliciousness. Here is a recipe that will please you immensely:

Half broil six or eight cutlets. Make a thick sauce of two tablespoonfuls butter, four tablespoonfuls flour and one cup milk, by melting butter, adding flour and then milk. Cook until thick. Add one tablespoonful grated onion, one-half teaspoonful salt, one-quarter teaspoonful paprika and one-half cup chopped Spanish green olives.

Cover each half-broiled cutlet with this thick compound; put cutlets back into the oven to finish the cooking and to brown them. Serve on hot platter.
