

PEACE MAY COME IN honors. 48 HOURS

Shopmen May Be Joined by Other Classes of Railroad Workers-Soldiers Are on Guard Duty in Twelve States.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 5 .- Events in the railway strike moved swiftly toward a crisis today, developments having crystallized to a point where a quick break in the tense situation may be created within 48 hours. This is according to government officials in close touch with conditions.

The break may come in the direction of peace or toward a more serious condition of affairs through the spread of the strike to other classes of railway workers besides the federated shop crafts. The opinion prevailed among officials that it would be in the direction of peace.

B. M. Jewell, national director of the shopmen's strike; William Johnston, president of the International Association of Machinists, the largest single unit involved in the tie-up, and John Noonan, head of the electrical workers, conferred at the White House this morning with President Harding for an hour. They refused to discuss the meeting, but it is understood the president sub-

mitted some proposals to them. It was learned they will remain in Washington for the time being.

Brown, it is said, was engaged for \$150 to carry out the acid throwing plot. He balked finally through fear and revealed the plan to police, according to inspectors at headquarters


