BUYERS WEEK IS PROVING SUCCESS IN PORTLAND

This is Buyers' week in Portland and the jobbers and manufacturers are having the biggest business ever experienced in the history of the city, according to reports that come from that source.

It is expected that at least 2500 buyers will register during the week. At present practically every state west of the Mississippi is represented, as well as one buyer from Hawaii and two from Bonnie Scotland. Entertainment is being furnished free of charge to all buyers who register, and it is expected in this manner to register nearly every one who comes to Portland during the week.

All of the big hotels are full to capacity, and are turning away people each day.

Reports indicate that buyers will give orders for more goods this year than ever before by almost half, showing that times are on the mend in this section of the country, despite reports to the contrary from other sources.

RAIN PROMISED ON COAST; MAY REACH ASHLAND

The weather bureau has promised rain for various points along the coast, and weather indications local are that rain is not far distant today.

The last rain in Ashland fell an even two months ago today on June 10, which was the end of a four-day rainy period. On June 7 there was rainfall to the extent of .60 of an inch, the following day .63 of an inch, .04 inch on June 9 and only .02 inch on June 10.

Since the latter date there have been very few clouds, and none that could be recognized as carrying rain until the last few days. Indications today are more favorable for rain than in the entire two months.
