

Papyrus Proves That Ancient Egyptian Physicians Were Fully Conversant With Important Organ.

Egyptian physicians in the days of the Hebrew patriarchs knew the heart is the center of a system, throughout which its pulsations are felt. They performed operations, made diagnoses, catalogued cases and verdicts, and pursued investigations in a scientific spirit, according to a study of the Edward Smith papyrus made by Prof. J. H. Breasted of the University of

Professor Breasted declared the ancient document lay in a coffin for "some three and a half millenniums." 


