The Duke of Talleyrand getting mixed up in the American newspapers with the Pekinese dog of the duchess, must certainly be gratifying to the vanity of his grace.

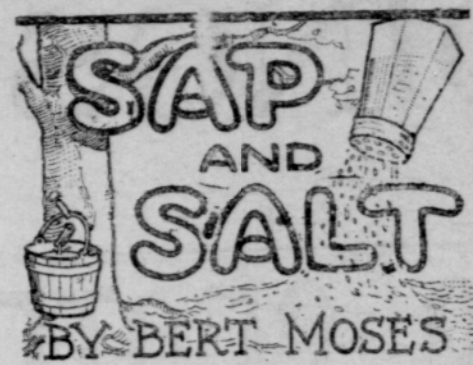
A headline in an eastern newspaper says: "Hearst's Chances Go Glimmering." We know quite a number of folks who would experience few pangs if it could be registered as permanent.
