LUMBER SCHOONER



Lovejoy, which loaded lumber at Rainier for San Pedro, has lost part of her cargo, her hold has six feet of water in it, and the vessel is aground on a sand bar in the Columbia river opposite Rainier.

It was shortly after the craft left her moorings at the Menefee mill at Rainier and headed for the sea that she took a decided list, losing a portion of her deckload and careening so far over to one side that she shipped water.
