

Plans were made months before the occasion. The good housewife carefully collected and selected the best of her culinary art and proof of her housewifery. The man of the family selected and groomed the best of his crops and his stock. The fair became a veritable market for produce raised in a limited area.

Later, the scope of the fair was broadened from local to county, state, country, until the great exposition where entire nations furnished exhibitions of their people and products was evolved.

It makes but little difference regarding the size of the fair, the spirit and underlying principle remains the same.
