FAIRS

Their manufactured products were unknown, as were the intimate details of their lives. Gradually the limitations of this sort of life dawned upon the race, and the need of more learning was impressed upon them. The ancient fair was a true holiday. Plans were made months before the occasion. The good housewife carefully collected and selected the best of her culinary art and proof of her housewifery. The man of the family selected and groomed the best of his crops and his stock. The fair became a veritable market for produce raised in a limited area.

EMPLOYMENT NORMAL IN PACIFIC COAST STATES

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 13.—Normal employment conditions along the Pacific coast are noted by J. A. Kelly, San Francisco, district director of the employment service, United States department of labor, in his report for the month of August, made public here yesterday. Although there is a slight general surplus of clerical help, according to Kelly, demand for experienced agricultural and lumber and building workers exceeds the supply.
 An abstract of Kelly's report on conditions in California, Oregon and Washington follows:
 California—All branches of industry except iron and steel and railroad repairs, at normal or above. Demand for agricultural workers and fruit pickers, has absorbed all surplus labor. Canneries are operating to capacity and affording considerable employment to female workers. There is a demand for experienced lumbermen and power construction workers.
 Oregon—Employment conditions have reached normal. Fishing, berry picking, canning, lumbering, logging, construction and manufacturing are at high tide, demanding all surplus labor. A number of new industrial plants have been completed and more in course of erection. Prune and hop harvest will demand more help than the local supply.
 Washington—Shortage of labor exists to a limited extent, in coast logging camps, harvest fields, agricultural pursuits, building trades and in Alaska. There is a surplus of clerical help. Forest fires and transportation have caused temporary suspension in several logging camps. Construction of buildings, highways, municipal improvements and dock facilities continues. All industries re practically normal. The fruit sections will require hundreds of outside workers, beginning the middle of September.

U. OF O. ELEVEN WILL FEEL LOSS OF STARS
UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Sept. 13.—Oregon's football prospects, so bright at the close of last year's season, are somewhat dimmed as the opening of practice on September 15 approaches, by the non-intention of Floyd and "Tiny" Shields, star guards of the 1921

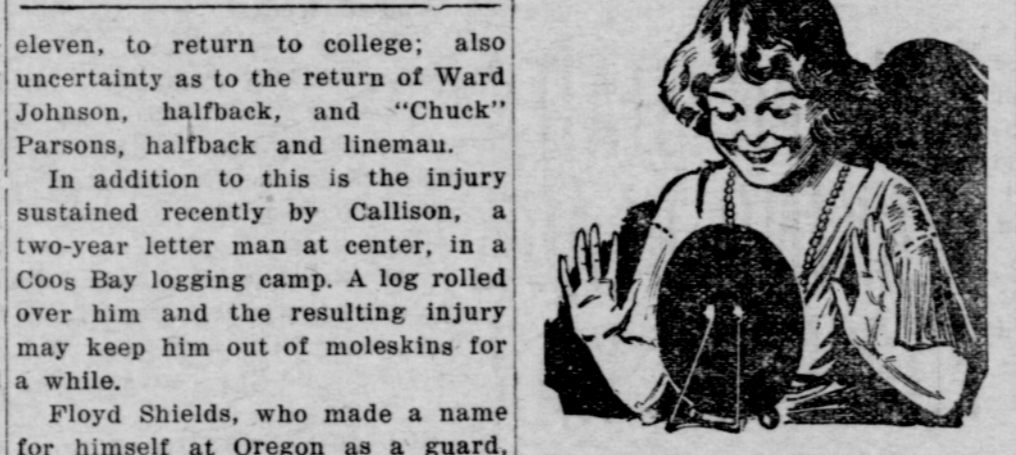
Giant Redwood on Display Well on Way To Maturity When The Pilgrims Landed

A cross cut of a giant redwood tree, computed by the state board of foresters to have been 347 years old when it was felled, is one of the interesting exhibits of the North Bay counties' booth at the California state fair. The study of the forestry experts indicates that the tree began its career about 1575, or only 83 years after Columbus discovered America.
 In the rich soil of the Humboldt coast, it thrived well and by 1587, when the first white child was born in America, it had a good start. By 1610 when the Dutch founded their first settlement, it was a foot in diameter. Several inches had been added to its thickness by 1620, when the Pilgrims came over in the Mayflower.
 The tree was thriving well in 1654 when Baltimore was founded, and was three feet thick by 1673 when the Mississippi river was discovered. Nearly another foot had been added by the time some educators got together and founded Yale college in 1700. The condition of the tree shows that the years 1731 to 1738 were very wet on the Humboldt coast and the tree grew very rapidly.
 It had reached six feet in diameter by 1776 when the Declaration of Independence was signed, and already was towering among the trees of the forest. The war of 1812

found it strong and vigorous, while the year 1833 indicated a drought.
 In 1848 a great wind storm hit the coast, and the tree was shaken to its very foundations, although deep scars were left in its sides. These show as "shakes," which later were covered with new growth.
 By the time of the Civil war it had fully recovered and again was growing rapidly. In 1873 it was damaged by a forest fire which left its unmistakable evidences on the sides of the forest giant, now eight feet thick. However, it survived the ravages of fire and by the time of the Spanish-American war, new bark had covered the burned and seared sides of the great redwood.
 It continued to grow until 1922, when, so the placard states, "after two years of prohibition, it died."

 PORTLAND, Sept. 13.—Episcopalian of California, the "wine state," wish the right to drink unfermented "juice of the wine," in holy communion instead of fermented wine if they so desire, according to a memorial presented to the house of bishops at the Auditorium yesterday by Bishop Joseph H. Johnson, of Los Angeles. Many clergymen and laymen of the diocese signed the memorial.
 If the general convention should not see fit to make the use of unfermented wine mandatory, the memorial asks that it "at least give permission to use the same to those priests and persons to whom this subject has become a question of conscience."
