REPUBLICAN TARTER BILL Plan Passage of Law Requiring Schools to Teach Provisions of the Constitution

National Security League Appoints Committee on Constitutional Instruction for Work in State Legis-

A law, requiring definite courses of instruction in the Constitution of the United States in all public schools, will be placed on the statute books of all the states when the work of the Committee on Constitutional Instruction, recently appointed by the National Security League, is completed. A special campaign to this end is planned in connection with the annual observance of "Constitution Day" on September 17, which is now generally observed by public schools and patriotic societies throughout the country, largely through the efforts of the League.

Lloyd Taylor, secretary of the National Security League, and a retired New York business man, who has devoted his attention in recent years to patriotic and welfare work, is chairman of the Committee on Constitutional Instruction. This committee has a membership of 200 which includes the presidents of practically all the leading colleges and universities of the country, the State Commissioners of Education or Superintendents of Public Instruction of nearly all the States. Among


