MANY PRIZES ARE OFFERED FOR BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS

A total of \$3525 in prize money, trips, awards and maintenance is being offered to the club boys and girls of the northwest who attend the Pacific International Livestock exposition, November 4 to 11, this year. Besides the regular prizes provided by the exposition and breed associations, there are several specials including \$500 given by E. A. Stewart, president of the exposition, which provides for 20 educational trips to the Carnation stock farm, at Seattle, one of the largest Holstein breeding establishments in the world, a \$25 prize scholarship to the state agricultural college offered by O. M. Plummer, and several others provided by farm paper publishers.

The Pacific International is outstanding among the expositions for its splendid support of this most fundamental work with rural boys and girls, which fact is more impressive because the expositions are the heaviest class of contributors supporting it. A total of \$90,000 is offered by state, interstate and national expositions this year as prize money for boys and girls in club work.

JACKSON COUNTY RECEIVES \$6172.44 FROM STATE FUND

SALEM, Or., Sept. 21.—A total of \$810,574.70, representing the net receipts of the state motor vehicle department for the six months' period, March 15 to September 15, 1922 was apportioned to the state highway commission and the various counties in Oregon by the secretary of state.

The apportionment was made on the basis of 75 per cent of the net receipts to the highway department and 25 per cent to the counties in proportion to the amount of money received from such counties for licenses. Of the total amount of money apportioned by the secretary of state, the highway department received \$607,931.02, and the counties \$202,643.68.

Of this amount, Jackson county will receive \$6172.44; Josephine, \$2589.86, and Klamath \$5898.61.

I. W. W. LITERATURE GRABBED IN RAID AT KLAMATH FALLS

KLAMATH FALLS, Sept. 21.—Raids by Sheriff Low and deputies on the private residence of Mrs. Ben Bond, a domestic worker, and her sister, Vera Moller, and on a rooming house, resulted in the seizure of a large quantity of I. W. W. literature and letters, the latter pertaining largely to an attempt to arouse sympathy for the six I. W. W. in jail here by means of a propaganda campaign.

Mrs. Bond, it was disclosed, had frequent access to the prisoners' cells by representing herself as a church worker. For this she was warmly complimented in a letter from Hazel Graves, 720 South L street, Tacoma, an alleged I. W. W. leader and organizer.

Sheriff Low says every effort will be made to uproot the I. W. W. here. No arrests were made.

NEW LAKE IS ADDED TO SHASTA NATL. FOREST

SISSON, Calif., Sept. 21.—Castle lake is being made accessible to the tourist by the Siskiyou board of supervisors, and the Sisson chamber of commerce.

A new road is now under construction, and shortly automobile parties may go to the lake shore from Sisson within an hour.

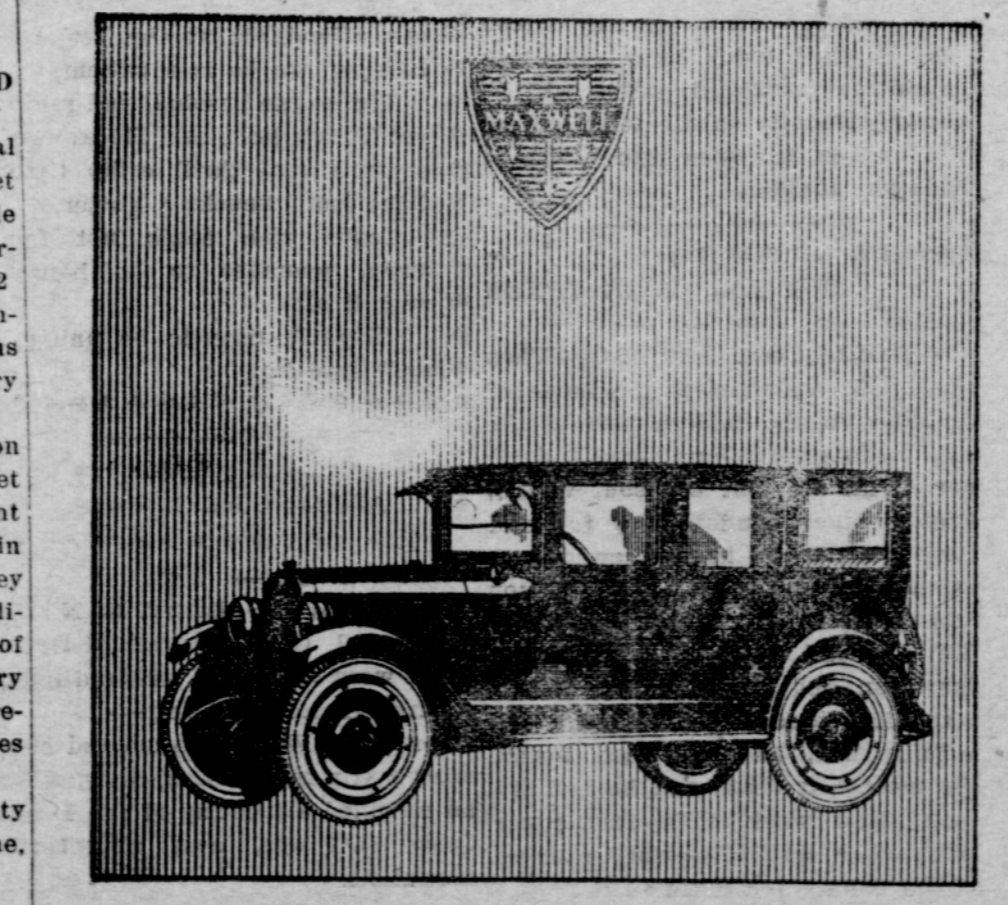
