Green Olive Lilies Spread butterthins evenly with cream cheese. Place one-half of stuffed olive on center of each. These look pretty and are delicious served with tea or coffee.

Boston Girls' Sandwich One slice each of white and brown bread, cut thin and buttered, cover with lettuce leaf, spread well with mashed cold baked beans, thickly strewn with finely chopped Spanish green olives.

Olive Tart Salad Four tart apples, three-fourths cup Spanish green olives, one stalk celery, one-half cup walnut meats. Cut olives, apples and celery into small pieces, moisten with mayonnaise and cover with chopped nuts. Serve in a nest of lettuce.

Norwegian Sandwich To one can sardines add one tablespoon chopped green olives, juice of one-half lemon, dash pa-prika and grain of salt. Make a paste of all. Spread between graham bread sliced thin.
