After the pullets are located for the winter see that their grit, shell and charcoal hoppers are kept filled and they have an unlimited supply of some succulent green feed daily.

Keep straight OLYMPIC EGG MASH in self-feeding hoppers before the hens all the time. Remember that OLYMPIC EGG MASH contains buttermilk in the form of a dry powder, and for every pound of mash eaten, the hen gets the equivalent of about a pint of liquid buttermilk. What this means is plainly shown in the egg basket.

The loging hens should eat about equal parts (by weight) of dry mash and scratch grain during the course of the day.


