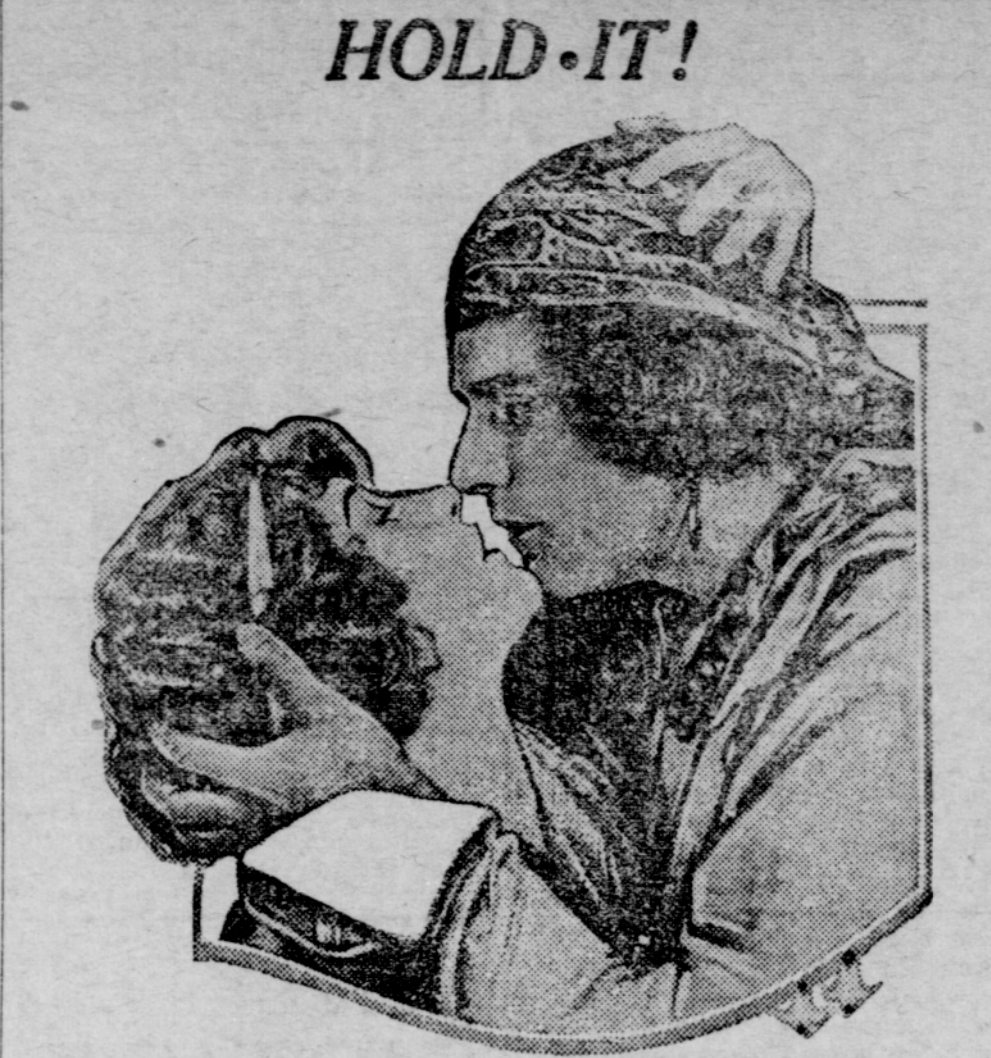

**PORTLAND ELECTRIC STORM TENTH IN PAST 58 YEARS**

PORTLAND, Oct. 5.—A heavy rain, which swept dirt and gravel down upon paved streets in the hill sections, and a strong wind, which brought ripened fruit and nuts down from swaying trees, accompanied a thunderstorm which swept over the city Tuesday evening.

The district weather office reported a total rainfall of .68 of an inch and a maximum wind velocity of 20 miles. Although an electrical disturbance accompanied the storm, the lightning was not reported to have struck any place within the city limits. The weather office reported that Tuesday's storm was only the tenth October electrical storm in 58 years.

**OLYMPIC**  
FEEDING THE LAYERS

After the pullets are located for the winter, see that their grit, shell and charcoal hoppers are kept filled and they have an unlimited supply of some succulent green feed daily.

Keep straight OLYMPIC EGG MASH in self-feeding hoppers before the hens all the time. Remember that OLYMPIC EGG MASH contains buttermilk in the form of a dry powder, and for every pound of mash eaten, the hen gets the equivalent of about a pint of liquid buttermilk. What this means is plainly shown in the egg basket.

The laying hens should eat about equal parts (by weight) of dry mash and scratch grain during the course of the day.

**Peculiar Deep-Sea Fish.**

The Aristeus, a deep-sea prawn, has a method of lighting that gives the appearance of a multitude of smoke rings. When excited by the nearness of an enemy, the prawn ejects respiratory water in tiny squirts and into this stream the luciferin is forced from countless glands opening into the stream by fine ducts. As the chemicals combine, puffy clouds of luminescent particles float in the sea. This is the "smoke screen" provided by nature.

The species of luminous fish, called "Photoblephron," has a dimmer system in an inside chamber and burns continuously. When the fish wishes to shut off the light, he causes a black pigmented curtain to slide down over the light cell's opening like an eyelid. The light organ preserves its luminescence even when removed and is used by fishermen of the Islands of Banda, about 800 miles southeast of the Philippines, as bait for night fishing.

**The Singer and the Song.**

A song is a great adventure. Thousands write it, tens succeed; and when they have succeeded, its fate still lies entirely with the singer. No one ever had it so much in his power to make the worse appear the better cause, or to refrain from so doing. The ancients placed Thamyris and Narada among the gods; the moderns pay their counterparts royalties. But the singer's personality is still incalculable in terms of canonization or of cash. That personality means all that he has been able to crowd into his life; and he may still enlarge it. A good way to do that is to read all the poetry that he does not sing, and to listen to all the music written for some other instrument than the voice.—A. H. Fox Strangways.
