BE ON SAFE SIDE

Words Once Written Cannot Be Obliterated.

Never Really Wise to Commit One's Self Too Strongly on Paper on Any Subject.

There are few precepts more worthy of acceptance than that which bids us to beware of the written word.

"Think before you speak," is excellent advice. "Think before you write, and then don't write or at any rate not what you had at first intended to say," is better.

To write a thing is far more serious than to say it. The glamour of personal presence is not there to color the meaning; the charm of manner, the shades of tone are lacking; the bare words must stand on their own merits.

We forget too often that written words cannot be followed by immediate explanations, may not be modified by inflection of voice or glance of eye. There can be no illuminating gesture, no merry or tender facial expression.

Moreover, it is impossible to foresee the frame of mind in which a letter may be received. It may be a mood to which perhaps the writer would never have addressed such words could he or she have known beforehand.

All this applies to ordinary letters written in confidence between friend and friend. Still more does it behoove women to beware of what they write to men. It is always best to be on the safe side, and not too near the edge, either.

The strictly punctilious person who would entirely prohibit letters between lovers would be hard of heart, indeed. What is more, any such objection would be useless. What would become of parted lovers if they might not write to one another? Telling one's love on paper may be an indescribable comfort when it cannot be told by word of mouth.

Nevertheless it is well for even fond lovers to remember that sweets are valued in exact proportion to their rarity. Affection should, if possible, be tempered with discretion.

Assurances of love in a woman's letter ought to be like the seasoning of a salad—carefully proportioned and not too strong. The love which shows between the lines is more alluring than that which is openly expressed.

Nor is it wise to commit oneself too strongly on paper with regard to what one will or will not do in the future. All these good resolutions and fair promises are apt to confront one later on to one's confusion and dismay.

It is useless to urge prudence upon people in love. "To love and to be wise in love is scarcely given to the gods above."

What, then, can be expected from mere mortals? When frequent meetings are impossible, the love letter has a more important part to play in courtship. Still, if people, women especially, would only remember that engagements are not unbreakable, and that those for whom letters are not intended sometimes see them, it might save infinite mortification and sorrow later on.—Exchange.
